Voting and the Census

Population data gathered by the 2020 Census determines how many congressional seats Ohio gets in U.S. House of Representatives for the next decade.

Population data gathered by the 2020 Census will also draw the lines for state legislative districts.

If you and your household are not counted in the 2020 Census, you will not be properly represented in the U.S. House Representatives or in the Ohio Statehouse.

Ohio's population has grown at a slower rate than other states in the last decade, so we are predicted to lose one seat already. Getting a full and complete count of the state is imperative to maintaining our power at the federal level.
